






MAGANDA MAKERS

Maganda Makers is a community of women who lift each other higher, to gain strength, inspiration and skills to build wealth through business. They believe economic independence has the power of transformation for any woman, her family and community.





CREATING A MORE EQUITABLE WORLD

Now is the time to bring economic independence and long-lasting inter-generational change for Indigenous women through sustainable business development. Woman to woman, mother to daughter, generation after generation - the cycle is continued.

Being an Indigenous woman entrepreneur in Australia is often not an easy path. Historical and gendered inequalities, and a lack of access to resources, education and training has made it difficult for Indigenous women entrepreneurs to participate in the economy and build financial security.

Good Return has partnered with the Kimberley Jiyigas and Menzies Foundation to support sustainable change within the Indigenous community. We have started in Western Australia in the Kimberley region with an innovative collective - the Maganda Makers Business Club.

What we're doing is different. The Maganda Makers work with experienced Indigenous businesswomen who guide, nurture and upskill emerging women entrepreneurs. We do this through a business club, podcasts and support for specific projects.





SHE IS LEADING THE WAY SO OTHERS CAN FOLLOW

Founded on a deep respect for Indigenous culture, the voices of Indigenous women drive the development and implementation of the Maganda Makers Business Club.

The program places Indigenous women in the driving seat, using their perspectives and insights to define the goal posts and guide the process. A community-centric, trauma-informed lens is applied across all aspects of the initiative.

Good Return is leveraging our experience to help drive this program. We are at the forefront of innovation in social finance and business skills training. For over twenty years our specialists have worked within local systems to change behaviour, and provide impact investments that bring the excluded into the economy. At the same time, we support local entrepreneurs to build skills and create opportunities to grow their business and take control of their futures. This has a compounded and generational impact.

Real change

- The Business Club started in 2021 and already has over 100 members.
- Powered by Club Captain Natasha Short, the Club is providing peer support, resources, opportunities, and connections to all members.
- The types of businesses emerging from the Club include fashion, arts and design, cultural tourism, bush tucker, bush medicine products, a range of consultancy businesses and more.
- The Club has a team of experienced business leaders called the 'Business Builder Navigators' who support and mentor other Indigenous women in their business journeys.
- The club model can be contextualised to other remote Indigenous communities.


Ethical alignment and ESG objectives
